

KĀKAHU Ā KURA / KURA UNIFORM

PURPOSE:

Rangatiratanga : That the child will feel a sense of pride in the kura and is a major contributing factor to the tone and uniqueness of Te Kura a Iwi o Whakatupuranga Rua Mano.

Manaakitanga: To ensure that our tamariki are dressed in appropriate kura attire at all times and that tamariki will feel an integral part of the kura wide community.

Kōtahitanga : To promote a learning environment where tamariki feel safe and secure.

Kaitiakitanga : That the child will learn to develop good practises with the care and maintenance of their appearance and that they are easily identified.

OBJECTIVES:

1. Students are expected to wear the correct uniform tidily at all times including moving to and from kura and during kura kaupapa and or trips when required and are expected to be clean and tidy..
2. Taura will be expected to dress appropriately for the occasion at all times. Wearing of correct school uniform is a condition of entry to Te Kura a Iwi o Whakatupuranga Rua Mano and sets the standard of appearance required for all tamariki.
6. Procedures for dealing with students who fail to comply with the Kura policy on uniforms will be developed by Kura Whakahaere / Senior Management in consultation with kaiako and whanau.
7. These procedures for dealing with tamariki who fail to comply with the Kura policy on uniforms will be made clear to all tamariki and whaanau.
8. The kura policy on uniforms takes into account the Human Rights Act which forbids discrimination on the grounds of sex, religions or ethical belief, colour, race, ethnic or national origin, political belief, disability or age.
9. The kura will endeavor to assist students whose families have difficulty purchasing the correct uniform. This may be in the form of a letter to WINZ, passing on donated used uniforms or issuing footwear for the day.

PLEASE NOTE:

- Taura without uniform will be issued kura uniform items on the day. These will be returned at the end of the day.
- Taura may wear plain ear studs or small sleepers, one in each ear, and one ring.
- No facial piercings to be worn at all.
- Cultural or religious jewellery may be worn discreetly. Notwithstanding this, a taura may be required to remove any jewellery or adornments on the grounds of safety or poor taste at the sole discretion of the kaiako, pouako and tumuaki.
- Make-up or nail varnish should not be worn with kura uniform.

SELF-REVIEW: This policy will be reviewed annually as part of the overall policy review for Te Kura a Iwi o Whakatapuranga Rua Mano.

1. WHAKATUPURANGA RUA MANO STANDARD EVERYDAY UNIFORM FOR KURA TAKAWAENGA & WHAREKURA TAU 7 – TAU 13 WILL CONSIST OF:

Tama:

- Navy blue / Light blue polo shirt
- Plain black trousers or plain black cargo shorts
- Plain black shoes, plain black jandles, plain brown or black sandals
- Kura jersey / Hoodie / Polo fleece

Kotiro:

- Navy blue / Light blue polo shirt
- Plain black skirt
- Plain black flat shoes, plain black jandles, plain brown or black sandals
- Kura jersey / Hoodie / Polo fleece

2. TE KURA Ā IWI O WHAKATUPURANGA RUA MANO KĀKAHU Ō KAWA / FORMAL UNIFORM WILL CONSIST OF :

Kotiro:

- Black knee-length skirt
- White Blouse (Wharekura)
- Navy blue / Light blue polo shirt (Kura Takawaenga)
- Stockings
- Black skirt
- Woollen Kura jersey

Tama:

- Black dress pants
- White shirt (Wharekura)
- Navy blue / Light blue polo shirt (Kura Takawaenga)
- Black dress shoes
- Black socks
- Woollen Kura jersey

TŌKENA / SOCKS, HOSIERY

1. Tama: plain turn top ankle sock or plain black under knee socks with shorts and plain black shoes.
2. Kohine: plain turn top ankle sock or plain black hosiery/pantyhose with skirt and plain black shoes or ballet flats

HŪ / FOOTWEAR

1. Tama: Plain black shoes.
2. Kohine: Plain black shoes or plain black ballet flats.
3. Sandals are plain black or brown leather roman sandals or similar sandals to be worn without socks or hosiery.
4. Jandles are plain black to be worn without socks or hosiery.

Note: All footwear must have low heels.

HAKINAKINA WHAKAPAKARI TINANA / PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Shorts or track pants, a tee-shirt or singlet, gym shoes.

Tauira are required to have a complete change of clothing for hakinakina, whakapakari tinana.

NOTE:

- **KURA TEINA kura uniform will stay the same with only the introduction of the darker polo shirt.**
